I. Introduction

After focusing on recycling and reducing, the final topic of the project was reusing, completing the three R's of climate action. From 13 March to 17 March, eight Czech, eight Spanish and sixteen Hungarian students worked in international groups to focus on different aspects of reusing. To introduce the topic and put students into the mood, we asked them to collect key words and using the key words, we created a unique, environment-themed [word cloud](#). We also asked the students to collect reusing ideas, companies from the three different countries. They uploaded their ideas into a [padlet](#). After the introduction we left the school building in order to take part in various outdoor learning activities. They included visiting an eco-village, a water treatment plant as well as the Humusz House, where they learnt various practical methods concerning reusing.

The students also created their own tote bags to reduce the use of plastic bags.



II. Preparations for the main outcome (the exhibition):

During the five-days of Mobility C6, the international groups of students got to know different Hungarian reusing practices. On the last two days, the groups created an exhibit from the waste material we had collected in advance.



III. The exhibits

The groups used various materials - from plastic bottles through toilet paper rolls to leftovers from the clothing swap - to prepare their works of art / useful everyday objects. The creators introduced their works to the guests in a few sentences. After the ceremony, the exhibits were put on display in the school corridor in a glass case so students of the school can see them.

Message: It's important to preserve bio-diversity.



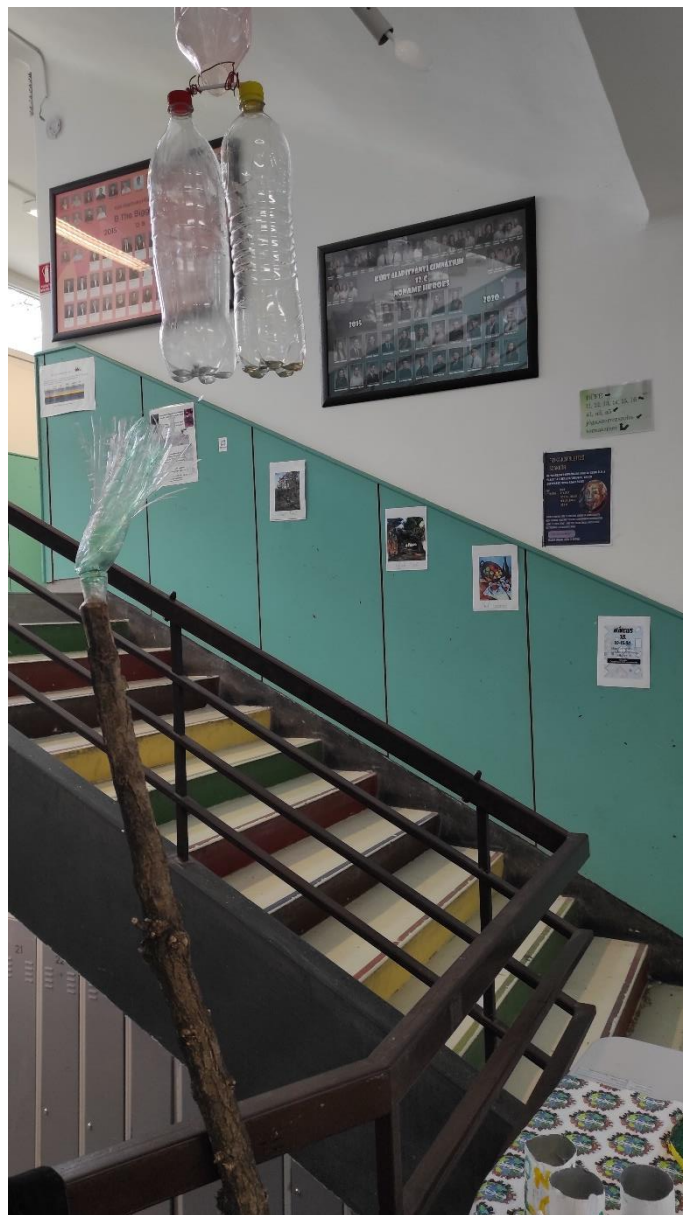
III/4. Plastic broomstick
